Next, let's make some Bird Seed Balls to attract birds to your garden!





• Lard • Pine Cone(s)

Birdseed
 Twine/String

### **Bird Seed Balls Recipe**

- Leave your lard out to warm to room temperature
- Clean the pine cone(s), then tie a long piece of string around the base of each one
- Mix the birdseed with lard until it all sticks together
- 4. Push the mixture between the pine cone scales to create your seed ball
- 5. Pop them in the fridge until the lard has set hard
- Hang the seed balls in a quiet, sheltered area

# BIRD FACT FILE!



Name: Starling

Fun fact: During the winter you may be lucky enough to see a starling murmuration. These flocks gather in the evening and perform amazing aerobatic displays which are one of the most beautiful and enchanting natural sights in the UK!

Name: House sparrow

Fun facts: House sparrows have
lived alongside humans since the
Stone Age and the oldest known wild
house sparrow lived for nearly two
decades. Sparrows have also been
recorded breeding in an English coal
mine 640 m (2,100 ft) below ground.



Name: Magpie

Fun facts: Magpies are closely related to crows and ravens and are one of the most intelligent birds. It is also thought that magpies recognise their own reflection in the mirror, which is amazing as only a few other species have demonstrated this ability!



Name: Robin

Fun facts: Robin eggs are light blue!

They are very loyal to their food sources. The Robin you see in your garden is most likely the same one each time. Although they may look the same, each Robin has a completely unique red breast pattern.



Fun facts: Blue tits are one of the most attractive and easily recognisable garden visitors in the UK due to their bright colourings of blue, yellow, white and green.

They also hang upside down from

branches and feeders to find food!

Name: Crow

Fun facts: Crows are extremely intelligent birds and they are known for their problem-solving skills. Amazingly research has shown that crows don't forget a face! A group of crows is called a 'murder' and when a crow dies they will surround the body to find out what killed their member.


